The ArtBreak Festival provides the entire region the opportunity to witness first-hand the results of quality Fine Arts instruction and Arts in Education programming. Through the combined efforts of school administrators, teachers, artists, our generous sponsors, and hundreds of community volunteers, we continue to grow and provide educational and creative opportunities at ArtBreak.

ARTBREAK HISTORY

ARTBREAK began in 1984 as a showcase of the successful curriculum based Arts Education instruction and supplemental community Arts in Education programs in Caddo Parish Public Schools. The Arts are critical to the education and total development of the student. More than 250 certified Arts instructors teach students, at all grade levels (K-12), music, visual art, and creative writing. This curriculum is supplemented by a comprehensive Arts in Education (AIE) program administered by the Shreveport Regional Arts Council (SRAC) and featuring seminars and hands-on art projects taught by professional artists, performances and community outreach. Program activities are designed by Teachers and Artists to transform STEM Learning to STEAM Learning through the Arts.

VERY SPECIAL ARTBREAK - the Caddo Public School Department of Exceptional Students works with SRAC to ensure that all students have an equitable opportunity to explore the Arts. Together, activities are provided to encourage students to apply a disability as an ability to create artwork.

ARTBREAK GOALS & OBJECTIVES

- ★ Showcase each school's visual, literary, cultural, performing arts, and creative programs.
- ★ Applaud individual student excellence in the areas of performing, visual and literary arts, as well as culinary, fashion, film and other art forms fostered in the schools and reviewed through a professional juried process.
- ★ Develop community respect for the positive impact of Arts Education through the promotion of the Arts Curriculum through programs and professional artist demonstrations.
- ★ Demonstrate the interdisciplinary nature of Arts in Education programming that correlates the basic skill STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) with Art Disciplines of Visual, Literary, and Performing Arts transforming STEM TO STEAM.
- ★ Teach students to make informed artistic choices through Student Choice Awards, Workshops and Hands-on Arts Activities.
- ★ Recognize and promote students' individual and unique artistic achievements through programs such as the Talent Show, Fashion Show, Culinary Art Competition, Film Prize Jr., and Portfolio Exhibitions.

Celebrating the Ability to use a Disability as the Ability to Create!

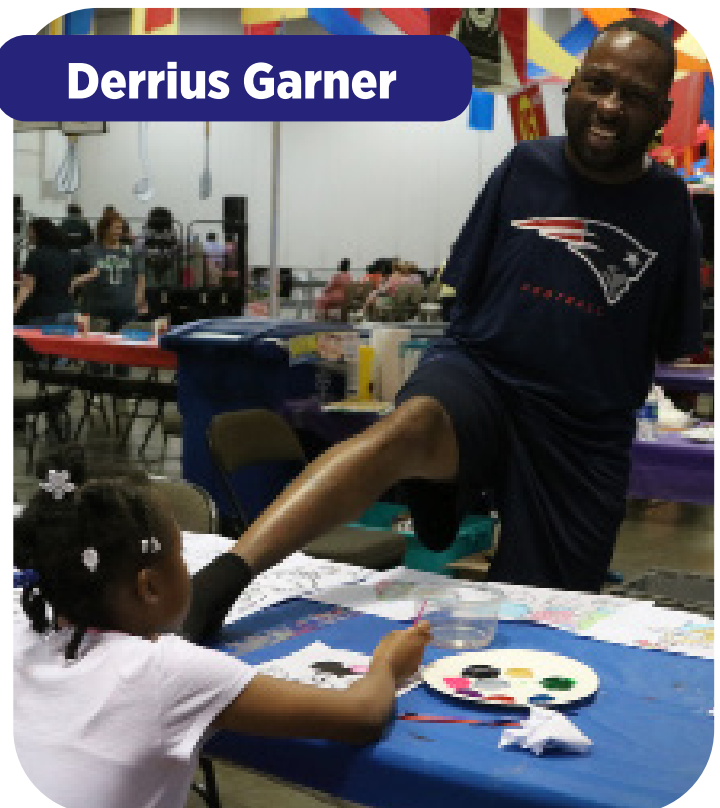
The Department of Exceptional Children, Shreveport Regional Arts Council (SRAC) and Caddo Parish Public Schools showcase artistic abilities of exceptional students.

ArtBreak's commitment to the inclusion of diverse students includes programming for students with exceptionalities to include:

1. Awards for outstanding Literary achievement
2. Awards for outstanding Visual achievement
3. Master Class with artist Eliza Redmann of Folded Poetry Wednesday, April 10, 8:30 AM - 2:30 PM
4. Interactive workshop with Eliza Redmann throughout the week
5. Unconventional Materials Fashion Challenge where Students create and submit a Fashion made of non-fabric materials such as newspaper, Mardi Gras beads, or food packaging.
6. Very Special ArtBreak award-winning Student Artist, Derrius Garner, returns as a Professional Artist to demonstrate Painting by Mouth and by Foot.

This celebration of all students is fulfilled by a Very Special Masterclass for students from the Caddo Parish Schools Department of Exceptional Children. In this one-of-a-kind experience the students receive training with a Professional Artist who uses a disability as an ability to create. Artists include Eliza Redmann, Derrius Garner, and more!

This 2024 ArtBreak celebration of all students features Eliza Redmann of Folded Poetry. After a car accident caused a traumatic brain injury, Eliza found she had cognitive and visual disruptions that made it impossible to return to her previous career as an architect. She started to create art inspired by her disability and background in architecture, as a form of creative healing. Eliza will provide a workshop that allows students to create geometrical cardboard artworks, called "Cool Qubes", and collaborate with other students to combine their works together to create a cohesive group sculpture that will be installed in the festival. Students will also learn about the importance of adaptability and creativity after setbacks. Some students may have physical or intellectual disabilities but that does not mean that they are undeserving of a life where they can also live out their passions and dreams. There are no limits! - Each participating school may request one booth space at NO CHARGE, for a \$50 REFUNDABLE deposit. Extra space is available for an additional \$50 fee per booth. Checks must be received by SRAC office March 30, 2023.
- CPPS Teachers can receive ½ day substitute to work on their booths Friday, April 5 from 12:00 pm to 3:00 pm. Request the time in advance; this is a pre-approved work day. This Professional ½ day will be charged to “Henry Price Inservice Account”.
- Booth set up is from Friday, April 5 Noon-6:00 pm, Saturday, April 6 9:00 am-Noon
- You may request electricity (110 outlets) for \$15 per outlet.
- School booths will be disassembled Monday, April 15 from 8:30am-11:30am
- **CPPS Only!! Caddo Warehouse will pick up and return your display boards if requested on your registration. They WILL NOT return items that they did not pick up. BOOTHS MUST BE READY FOR PICKUP AT YOUR SCHOOL Monday, March 18.**

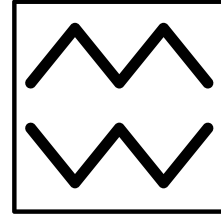
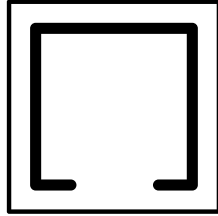
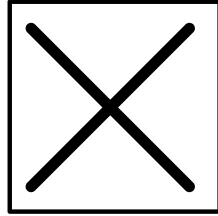
- Freestanding display equipment, such as bulletin boards, dividers, display boards, etc.

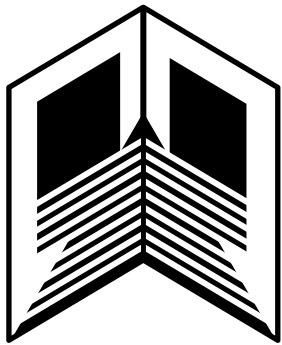
Here are some suggestions for ArtBreak school display booths:

Here are a few example top views (Birds Eye View) of booth areas:



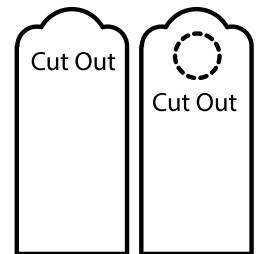
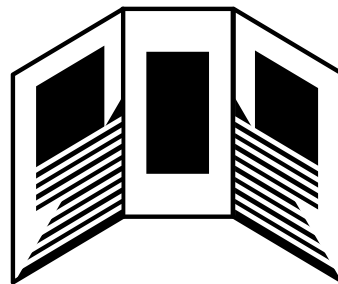
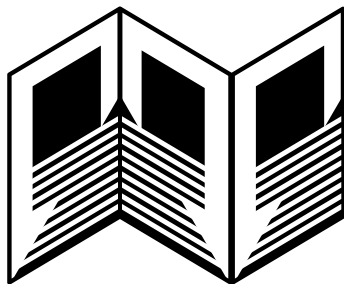
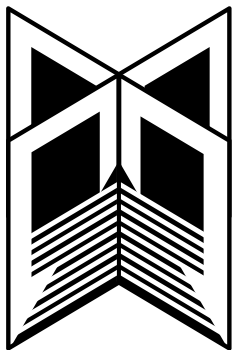
THESE ARE EXAMPLES OF BOOTHS:



Portable partitions “display boards”, range in price from \$200 - \$600 per panel available from Sax Arts and Crafts, Triarco Arts and Crafts, or many other internet sources. Very durable, multipurpose.

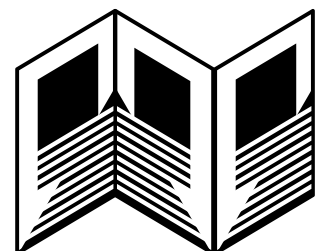
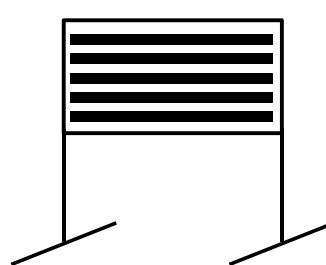
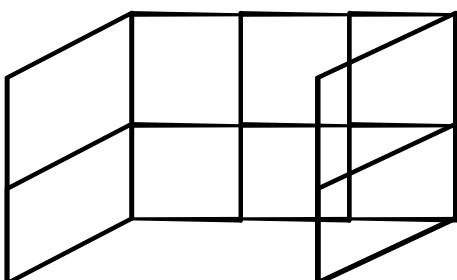
4' x 8' “standard” size. Lattice is popular but requires a structural frame. The cost can vary from \$180 - \$280 (4 frames) depending on finish and thickness of lattice, hinges, and paint. Fairly durable, requires carpentry.

Blueboard Styrofoam is the cheapest, but least durable for the long term. Four sheets cost \$100.00 available from Regal Plastics on Greenwood Rd. (Note: Mention Shreveport Regional Arts Council and ArtBreak for 5% discount) Easy to fasten pictures, paint and support. Can be cut easily with jigsaw.



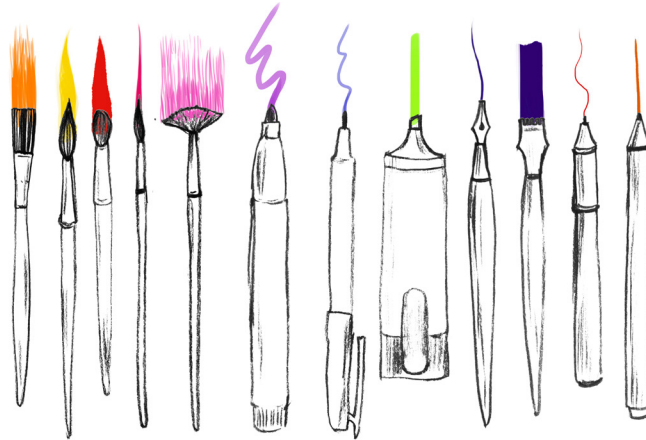
Fencing panels are also popular and easy to assemble. Cost about \$40.00/panel 6'x6' at Home Depot or Lowes. Need hinges and a little bracing.

2" PVC piping (thinner is too flimsy) and chicken wire. Cost about \$100.00, mostly in fittings.

The Visual Competition spans Early Childhood Education through 12th grade

CATEGORIES FOR VISUAL WORK

DEFINITIONS:

2 Dimensional works will be defined as works of art having its elements organized in terms of a flat surface, especially emphasizing the vertical and horizontal character of the picture plane. Its linear perspective has width and height but has not thickness.

3 Dimensional works will be defined as follows: Sculpture is the art of making figures or designs in relief or in the round. Sculpture may be made by carving (subtractive process), by modeling (additive process), or by assembly (assemblage). Sculpture in the Round is freestanding and may be viewed from all sides. Relief Sculpture is created on or against a background surface, with forms projecting from the background and range from bas-relief (low) to alto-relief (high).

Unconventional Fashion works will be defined as a "Fashion Look" made of non-fabric materials such as paper, DVD's, zippers, Mardi Gras Beads, vacuum cleaner bags, food packing, zippers, safety pins, or ANYTHING that can be manipulated and applied to a piece of clothing.

2024 VISUAL AWARDS

The receipt of an ArtBreak award entitles the Shreveport Regional Arts Council to unlimited reproduction rights to the student's work; however, the original artwork is returned to the student (there is no purchase award).

- **\$500 BEST OF SHOW for VISUAL:** One overall award for Outstanding Visual Artwork.
- **\$500 BEST OF SHOW Very Special Arts:** There is one Special Education \$500 Best of Show Award in Visual Art. This award is for student artists with disabilities who are enrolled in the Special Education program.
- **\$500 High School and \$200 Middle School Visual Portfolio Awards:** There is one \$500 Visual Portfolio Award presented to an outstanding high school junior or senior and one \$200 Visual Portfolio Award presented to an outstanding 8th grade student. Each school may submit portfolios for consideration.
- **\$500 O. DELTON HARRISON PORTFOLIO AWARD:** Award for one 11th Grade High School Student for supplies to continue their craft.
- **\$250 MILES FOR SMILES AWARD:** One award for the visual artwork featuring the best smile on a physical being.
- **\$100 Best of Grade/Level:** There is one \$100 Best of Level Award per grade level ECE – 12 in Visual Art (14 awards).
- **\$100 Best of Elementary, Middle and High for Very Special Arts**
- **\$100 Best of Photography Award in memory of Neil Johnson**
- **\$100 Image of ArtBreak Awards:** Up to 10 visual pieces will be selected from all grade levels. These selected pieces will be reproduced and used to create ArtBreak stationary, prints, t-shirts, and other promotional material throughout the year.
- **\$50 Media Awards:** There are designated \$50 media awards in the Visual Arts that recognize skill sets, and creativity in a variety of media.
 1. These media specific awards will be presented in the Elementary, Middle, and High School divisions and will be listed in the Guidelines.
 2. Visual Art media specific awards are as follows:

*The awards are made at the discretion of the judges.

- **Jurors Choice Awards:** There are up to 3 Jurors Choice Trophies per grade level.
- **Showcase Ribbons:** Every piece selected by the school for the ArtBreak Juried Visual Exhibition will receive a showcase ribbon.
- **Student Choice Award:** Each school may select two students to participate in a Student Choice Workshop in Visual Art. Students review the ArtBreak Juried Visual Exhibition, selecting pieces worthy of the Student Choice Award Ribbon.
- **\$500 Unconventional Fashion Award:** Individuals or a small team of “fashionistas” will have the opportunity to create a “Fashion Look” made of non-fabric materials such as paper, DVD's, zippers, Mardi Gras Beads, vacuum cleaner bags, food packing, zippers, safety pins, or ANYTHING that can be manipulated and applied to a piece of clothing. Each piece school be school appropriate materials and constructed to be able to take on and off a mannequin.

NOTE: All monetary awards are issued in the form of a check, and made payable to the student and will be available for pick up after winners are announced at the awards ceremony **Sunday, April 14, 2024.**

VISUAL ELIGIBLE ENTRIES PER SCHOOL

ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS (ECE – 5th grades): Caddo Parish Schools will be eligible to enter **up to 5%** of the student population into the Visual Exhibition. This will apply to public schools, private schools, home school associations, charter schools and the Talented Arts Program.

- The entries should reflect the student population by grade level.
- The teacher will divide the total number of entries equitably (but not necessarily equally) among each of the seven grade levels (ECE-5).
- A student may have up to two (2) entries per school.

MIDDLE SCHOOL (6th - 8th grades) and High School (9th – 12th grades):

Middle School and High School entries will be based on enrollment in the Visual Arts Classes. Visual Instructors should divide the entries equitably on all grade levels (6-8 and 9-12) based on enrollment numbers.

- The school may enter **10%** of work by students enrolled in the **Visual Arts** classes. For example:
 - In all semesters, there are 200 students enrolled in Visual Art; the school is eligible to enter 20 pieces based on that enrollment. The teachers together are eligible to enter a total of 20 pieces of art.
 - A high school employs two teachers who instruct Art I, II, III, and IV, Ceramics, and Photography. There are 450 students enrolled in arts classes. The teachers together are eligible to enter a total of 45 pieces of art.
- The teacher will divide the total number of entries among each of the three Middle School grade levels (6-8) and four High School grade levels (9-12) equitably (but not necessarily equally).
- A student may have up to two entries per school. The Middle School and High School entries apply for Caddo Public Schools, private schools, home school associations, charter schools and the Talented Arts Program.

UNCONVENTIONAL FASHION

- Individuals or a small team of “fashionistas” will have the opportunity to create a “Fashion Look” made of non-fabric materials such as paper, DVD’s, zippers, Mardi Gras Beads, vacuum cleaner bags, food packing, zippers, safety pins, or ANYTHING that can be manipulated and applied to a piece of clothing. Each piece school be school appropriate materials and constructed to be able to take on and off a mannequin. Unconventional Fashion piece must be turned in on its own mannequin for display.

TALENTED ARTS PROGRAM

- The Caddo Parish Talented Arts program seeks to screen, identify, and provide services for children who possess Unique Talent in the Visual or Performing Arts. The focus of the program is to provide an accelerated curriculum based on the National Standards for Arts Education and the Louisiana Arts Content Standards to students identified as talented in each of the following areas: Visual Arts, music: Vocal and/or instrumental, and Theater.
- The guidelines for (5) entries per school for the TAP in Visual Arts and Musical Composition have not changed.
- TAP entries must be titled with “TAP – School Name”

DEPARTMENT OF EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN:

VERY SPECIAL ARTS (VSA)

- Very Special Arts (VSA) is dedicated to enriching the lives of children, youths & adults with disabilities.
- The guidelines for five (5) entries per school for the VERY SPECIAL ARTS Special Education Showcase in Visual Arts and Literary Art.
- Winners will be selected as follows: One “Best of Show” Visual and one winner for outstanding Visual work in Elementary, Middle and High School.

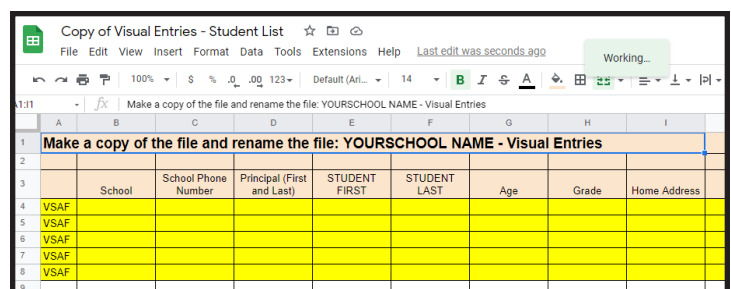
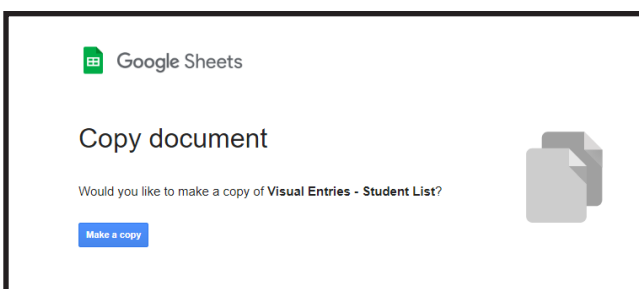
- Make copies of the **2 PER Agreement and Statement of Originality** form to send home with your students per the entry guidelines. These can be cut to just send 1 of the forms home if the student only has 1 entry.
- Once the student has returned their signed form, make a copy of the form for your records.
- Attach the Agreement and Statement of Originality form to the back, UPPER LEFT-HAND CORNER of all 2-D pieces. 3D pieces need the form attached to the bottom of the base.
- Attach the VISUAL TAG (Downloaded at: <https://www.artbreaksb.com/teacher-links>) to the LOWER RIGHT-HAND CORNER on the back of the piece so that it hangs below the mat (do not use tape on the front of the piece). **See sample images on page 16.**
- Ensure the tag on the bottom of the piece can easily be folded under the base for 3D work and behind the piece for 2D entries.
- Ensure student name and title of work is entered into the Google Sheet accurately as that is how it will go on display.

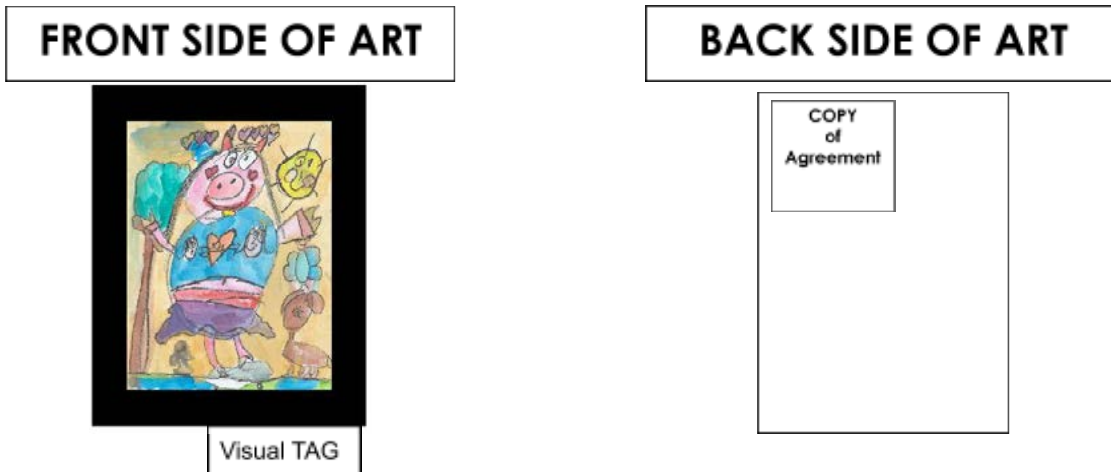

2024 LITERARY AWARDS

The receipt of an ArtBreak award entitles the Shreveport Regional Arts Council to unlimited reproduction rights to the students' work.

- **\$500 BEST OF SHOW Very Special Arts:** There is one \$500 Best of Show Award in Literary Art for student artists with disabilities who are enrolled in the Department of Exceptional Children program.
- **\$500 High School and \$200 Middle School Literary Portfolio Award:** There is one \$500 Literary Portfolio Award presented to an outstanding high school junior or senior and one \$200 Literary Portfolio Award presented to an 8th grade student. Each school may submit Portfolios for consideration.
- **\$250 MILES FOR SMILES AWARD:** One award for the literary piece that invokes the biggest smile.
- **\$100 Best of Grade/Level:** One \$100 Best of Level Award will be awarded per grade level, ECE – 12 in Literary Art (14 awards).
- **\$100 Best of Elementary, Middle and High for Very Special Arts.**
- **\$100 Image of ArtBreak Awards:** Up to 10 pieces will be selected from all grade levels. These pieces will demonstrate the creativeness and excitement of the students' writing. These selected pieces will be reproduced and used to create ArtBreak promotional material throughout the year.
- **\$50 Genre Awards:** There are designated \$50 Genre Awards in Literary Arts that recognize skill sets and creativity in a variety of styles of writing. These Genre specific awards will be presented in the Elementary, Middle, and High School divisions:

LITERARY ARTS EXHIBITION ELIGIBLE ENTRIES PER SCHOOL

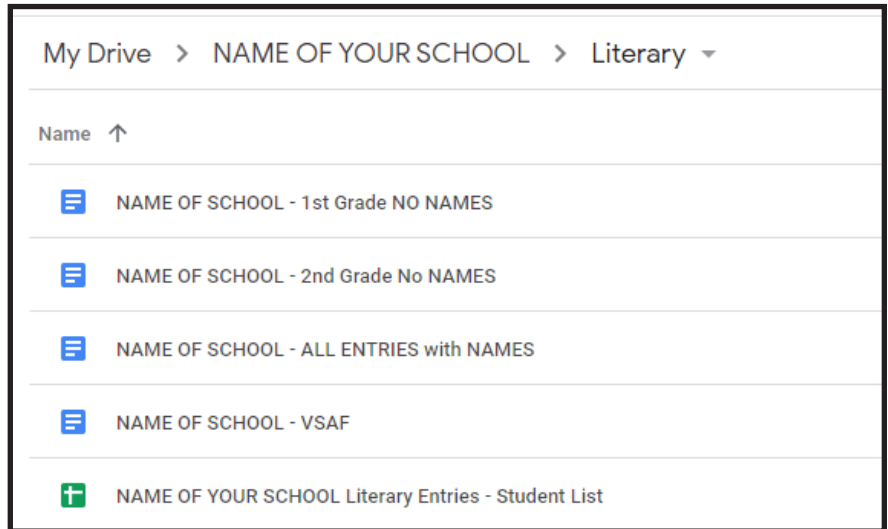

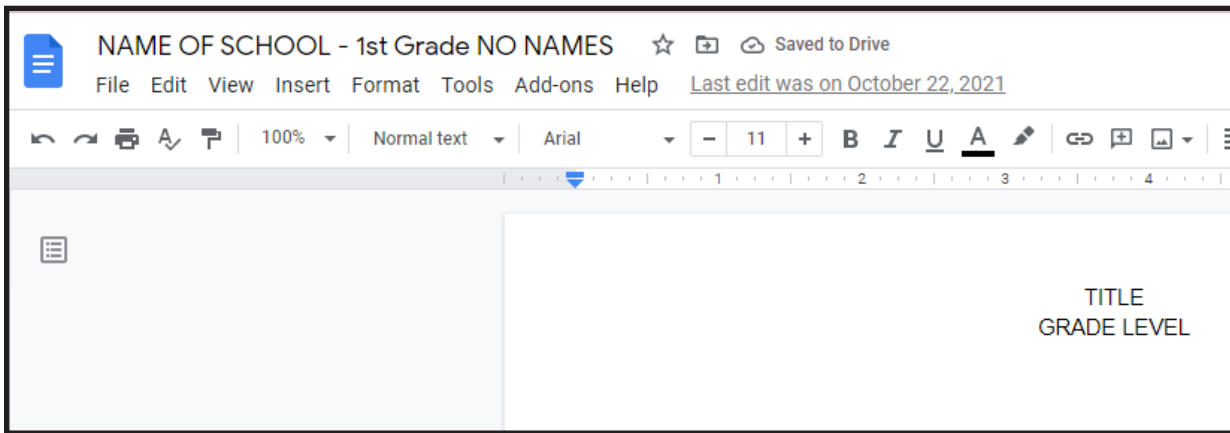

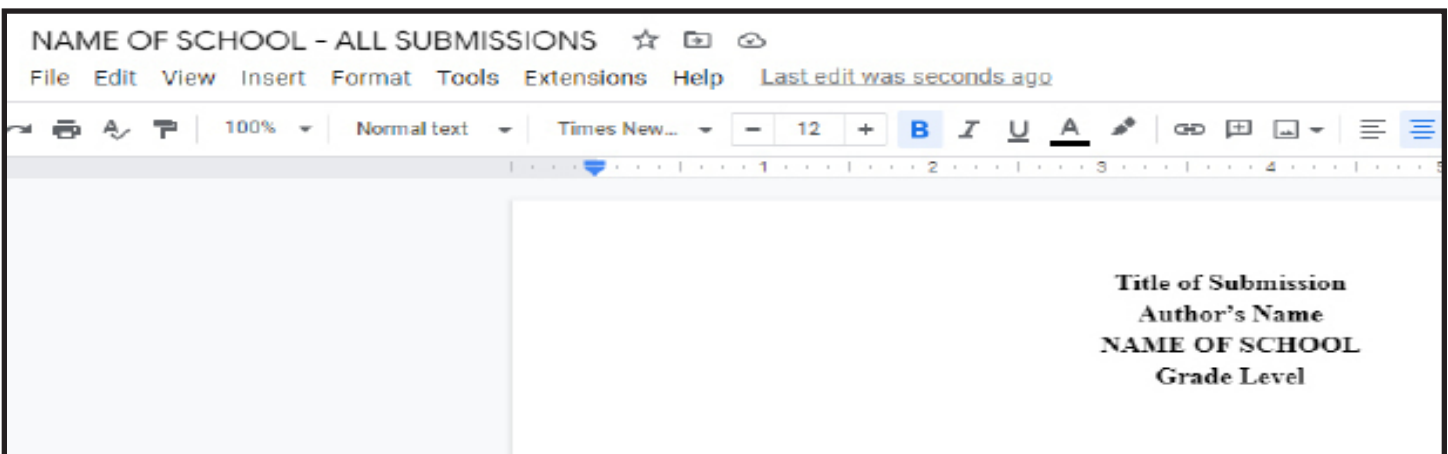
Screenshot of Google Folder Setup:
